
Loretta Lynn: The Coal Miner's Daughter Who Conquered Country Music





Coal Miner's Daughter by Loretta Lynn

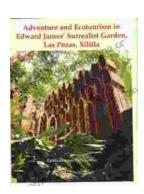
