
# Penelope Bungles to Broome: New Speciality Titles Announced

#### **Paediatric Surgery**

The new title of "Paediatric Surgeon" will be awarded to doctors who have completed specialist training in paediatric surgery. This title will help to distinguish these doctors from those who have completed their training and are eligible for the title of "Adult Intensive Care Specialist".


### **Emergency Medicine**



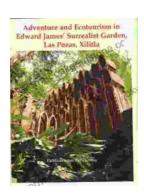
