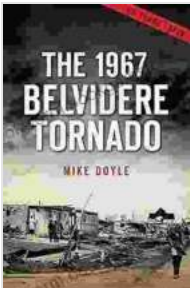

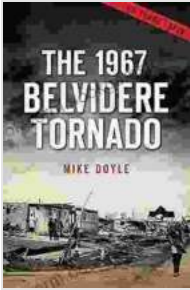
Tips for Tornado Safety

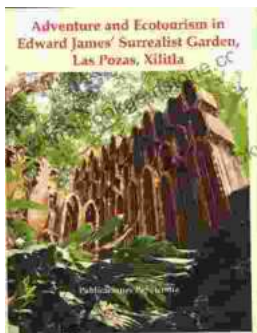
